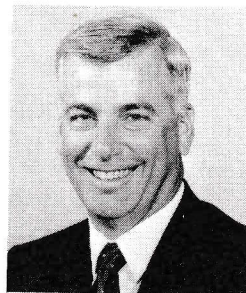

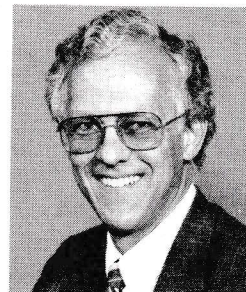

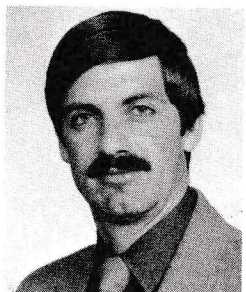

SAN FERNANDO VALLEY ENGINEERS' COUNCIL

The San Fernando Valley Engineers' Council was founded in 1955 through the joint interests of the California Society of Professional Engineers, The American Institute of Industrial Engineers, The American Institute of Plant Engineers, The American Society of Manufacturing Engineers and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers to celebrate National Engineers' Week, which was originally celebrated in 1950.

During the next several years the interest expanded from having a joint meeting of all societies to the beginnings of an awards banquet for those deserving professionals whose accomplishments warranted recognition by their peers.

The 1959 Banquet was special. The first Engineer of the Year was selected and presented to Roy E. Marquardt, one of the most respected engineers in the San Fernando Valley. His accomplishments and technical innovation became a benchmark to measure all other candidates selected to receive this prestigious Award.

The next milestone for the S.F.V.E.C. was the selection of the Honorary Engineer of the Year in 1970. Nationally known individuals with a variety of backgrounds have received this award and proudly display it in their office. William Lear was the first, followed by Mr. Christopher C. Kraft Jr., Dr. David R. Scott, Major General James W. Stansberry, President Ronald Reagan and Malcolm Baldrige to name only a few.

The last major Award to be added was the Peter Recchia Omni Memorial Award in 1973, which is presented to the Engineer of the Year. Originally it was named the Omni Award, designed and donated by Mr. Peter Recchia, later to be renamed when he passed away. Today Mrs. Peter Recchia continues her late husband's support of the engineering community by presentation of this award each year.

To date, the San Fernando Valley Engineers' Council has presented over 600 various awards to recognize outstanding contributions by individuals in Engineering, Education and Public Service in our communities.

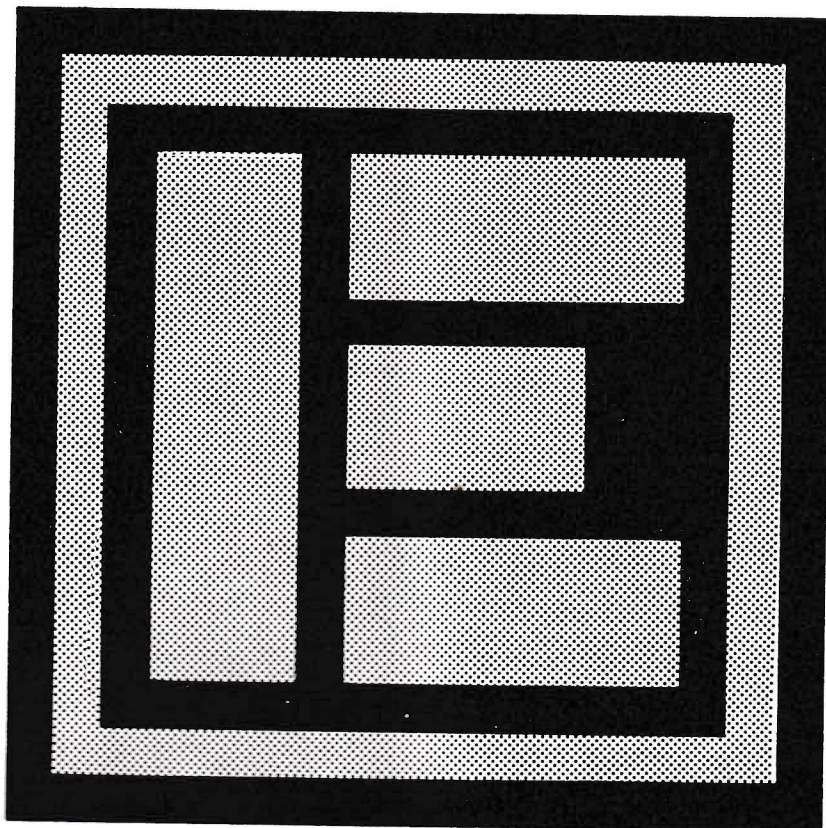

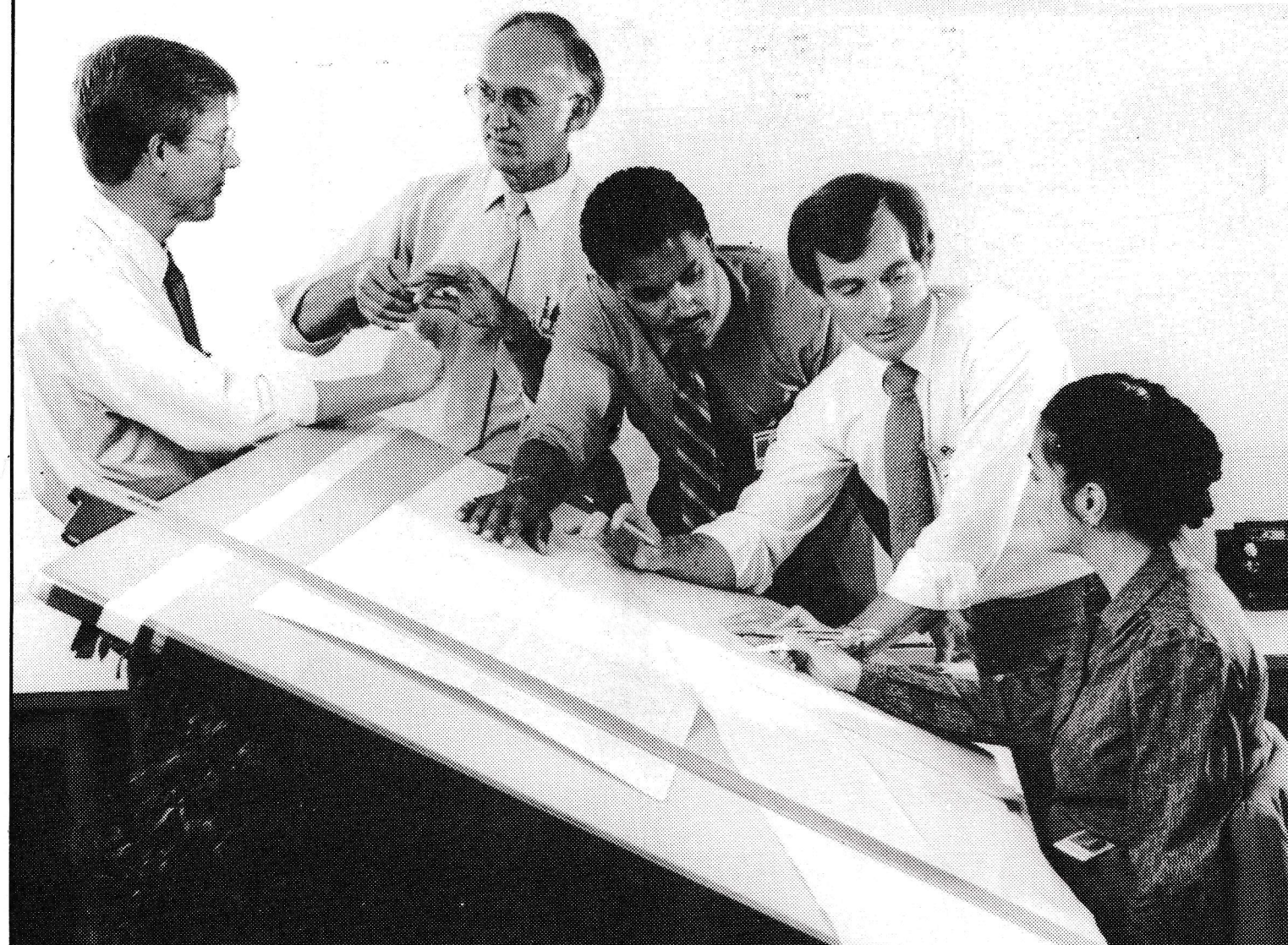
